


CoastHills New Online Banking Login

3 Easy Steps

1. Enter Username & Password


Use the same username as the old platform. Your temporary password is: 1234 plus last 4 digits of your Social Security Number.
Example: 12349876.

2. Set a New Password


Make sure you use a strong password with at least eight characters of lowercase and uppercase letters, numbers, and symbols.
